

By-Law 2023-734 is meant to prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other invasive species.

The responsibility is ours to protect our lake and our river from this environmental threat! Boat owners are required to have their boats washed at the wash station to receive a certificate before heading out on the water.

User certificates for residents are available at the following costs:





Extreme heat is not to be taken lightly

Did you know that when the outside air temperature is 23°C, the temperature inside a vehicle can reach over 50°C?



Many places in Canada have a high number of extreme heat events or heat waves. Extreme heat can put your health at risk, **causing illnesses like heat stroke and even death**. It is important to take precautions to protect your health and the health of your family and loved ones.

What are the signs and symptoms of heat illness?

- Heat exhaustion can cause skin rash, muscle cramps, dizziness or fainting, nausea or vomiting, heavy sweating, headaches, extreme thirst, dark urine and decreased urination. If you experience any of these symptoms during extreme heat, immediately move to a cool place and drink water preferably.
- Heat Stroke is manifested by a high body temperature, confusion and lack of coordination, dizziness or fainting, no sweating, but very hot, red skin. Heat stroke is a medical emergency! Call 911 or your local emergency number immediately.

While extreme heat can put everyone at risk from heat illnesses, health risks are greatest for the elderly, infants and young children, people with chronic illnesses (like breathing problems, mental illness and heart problems), people who work or exercise in the heat, homeless people and people with low-incomes.

During extreme heat, the most important thing is to keep cool and hydrated. Remember that you should never leave people or pets inside a parked vehicle or in direct sunlight.



The Circuit des arts will soon welcome visitors for its 30th edition!

With its picturesque towns and villages, the MRC Memphrémagog region abounds in bucolic landscapes, so it's no surprise that many artists come here to live and create. The Circuit des arts Memphrémagog is an opportunity for many of them to come out of the shadows and welcome visitors to their Alibaba cave! For its thirtieth anniversary, the Circuit is continuing to renew itself, and is keen to offer its many visitors from all over the world a different and varied experience.

Indeed, in 2024, the Circuit team is proud to offer a line-up of 33 professional artists who practice their art in a wide range of disciplines and media. Textile arts, stained glass, jewelry, ceramics, pottery, weaving, textile finishing, silk mosaics, floral art, blown glass, garden sculpture, and of course sculpture, painting, mixed media, collage, drawing, printmaking (various techniques including silkscreen, etching, collagraphy, monotype) are just a sample of what the artists have in store for all those who drop by their studios!

From June 29 to July 7, 2024, visitors are invited to meet the artists in their studios or in a designated collective space, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and to take part in the Coup de cœur competition. It's also possible to visit several of the participants at any time during the summer, and even throughout the year, sometimes by appointment or according to a schedule that's easy to consult on their websites. Some of them also offer creative workshops or regular training courses.

By consulting the website and the event brochure (available in many shops and public establishments in the Memphrémagog MRC), it's easy to make your own choices and put together an itinerary, starting with a visit to the group exhibition presented from June 26 to July 28, from 10am to 5pm, at the Centre d'arts visuels de Magog (61, rue Merry Nord, Magog). The vernissage will take place at the same location on Thursday, June 27 at 5 p.m., where everyone is invited to meet the artists of the 2024 cohort, as well as several artists who have participated in the Circuit over the past 30 years. ENVIRO NEWS - VILLAGE OF NORTH HATLEY

The Village of North Hatley takes environmental issues seriously and has by-laws in place to address a few subjects that concern our daily activities. The following is a summary including upcoming activities and general news concerning how we care about our environment.



PESTICIDES

If you use pesticides for lawn care or hire a lawn care company, they must contact the Municipality before using any lawn care products to find out about the prohibitions and exceptions set out in sections 3 and 4 of By-law number 2002-442 concerning the use of pesticides. Fines will be imposed in case of infraction.



TREE CUTTING

Trees are part of our heritage and are protected. When mature trees need to be removed for any reason the Municipality must be notified and a Permit process is in place. By-law 2001-432, art. 13.4, protects our urban forest. Fines will apply for infractions.



RECYCLING WASTE

A large portion of our budget goes to waste removal. You can help by:

- using your home sorting bins correctly (https://cavaouwebapp.recyc-quebec.gouv.qc.ca/);
- having big items sent to recycling centers (info previously distributed);
- using the (SHERBROOKE) recycling center when you need to dispose of items quickly;
- consulting our schedule for removal of big items;




LAKE FRONTAGE AND PROTECTION OF LAKE MASSAWIPPI

We have sent information packages to property owners stressing the importance of maintaining a natural landscape at the shoreline. This "naturalization" prevents runoff into the lake and helps maintain the quality of our lake. A program set up by the Memphrémagog MRC was even put in place to provide plants at a very affordable price. Citizens were notified via Info-letter, our website and Facebook

TOP 10 TICK HIDING SPOTS ON YOUR BODY


Tick checks are one of the ways you can prevent Lyme disease and other infections spread by ticks. Check your entire body, especially:
